





1. Fitness for Purpose

The purpose of my solution is for the garment to be worn while playing tennis. It needs to fit this purpose well by using the right fabrics, shapes etc. For example it can't be made out of something impractical like heavy fabrics or stiff fabrics because then it will affect the way the person can move. It would also affect the player's stamina because they could get too hot too quickly and it could make the player sweat too much. These things need to be on my mind as I design and make this garment so it will fit the purpose. My research will be able to help me use the right sort of fabrics and shapes that will it this purpose.

I think this is the most important factor because this is the whole point of the project. If it doesn't fit the purpose of being a lightweight, breathable tennis dress that doesn't restrict movement, then I won't be able to give it to my client because it won't fit her needs and won't be what she has asked for

Fitness of purpose relates to materials because the fabric and materials I use will need to work with the purpose of a tennis dress not against it by being breathable, lightweight and able to move with the wearer. It relates to ergonomics for the same reason. It relates to the aesthetics as well because as I am making a sports dress it will need to look like that rather than looking like a ball gown.

> I can't bite off more than I can chew. There are no extension opportunities so for me to pass it needs to be handed in on time. This means I need to keep this on my mind the whole time so I can finish tasks on time and don't bite off more than I can chew so I can hand in a quality solution on time.

> Time relates to materials and aesthetics because the materials I use for this need to be quite easy to use so I don't waste too much time trying to work with them. This could also affect the aesthetics of the finished solution because the amount of time I have to complete my solution may limit the amount of techniques I will be able to use to change the look of it.

3. Ergonomics

Sports garment- needs to be suitable for sports. The garment will need to be able to move with the wearer, it can't restrict any movement because then it will start to affect the way the person plays rather than help it. The fabric will need to be light and breathable so the person doesn't get too hot or use energy carrying around extra weight of heavy fabrics. It will need to be well fitting so any tightness or looseness doesn't affect the player.

Ergonomics is very important for my solution because that is what sportswear is all about. creating garments that will move with the person playing sport to aid their playing. It is very important that it is able to move with the body, breath and not distract the player (e.g. by being too loose/tight/heavy) otherwise it stops being fit for the purpose because it would start to affect the wearer's playing ability.

Ergonomics relates to fitness of purpose like it says in the fitness of purpose section, it relates to materials because the materials I use need to be right for the ergonomics, being able to move with the player etc but it also relates to two key factors I haven't talked about, hygiene & health and shape & size. Hygiene and health means that the garment needs to not restrict movement too much because it could cause injuries also try to make the garment breathable so the wearer doesn't sweat too much. 



#### Trenchcoats and cardigans up the fashion stakes

On a gloriously sunny afternoon at Wimbledon, Serena Williams strode on to

With the sun beating down on Centre Court, defending champion Roger Federer appeared in a cardigan. All that was missing was his pipe and slippers.

"Game, Set and Mac, Miss Williams," the Daily Express decided today after the 26-year-old former champion grabbed all the headlines with the most eye-catching outfit on day one. Williams made a stuttering start before overcoming Estonia's Kala Kanepi – but reporters afterwards were more interested in her outfit than her tennis.

Was it a Sixties retro look? Can you tell us about the fabric? Is it lightweight or porous? No question was too trivial.

Federer, seeking his sixth Wimbledon title in a row, swapped his white blazer for a Great Gatsby-style cardigan which also had reporters seeking fashion tips.

It felt more like a day on the catwalk than the opening of the world's most famous tennis tournament – but fashion has always been an integral part of Wimbledon with its strictly enforced "predominantly white" dress code for players.

After last year's rain-soaked Wimbledon, spectators blinked in amazement at the sunny start to the 2008 tournament and Serena Williams joked about her outfit "I don't think it's going to keep the rain away but we can always hope."

"I absolutely love trench coats. I live in Florida. I probably have more coats than anybody." she said.

But she admitted "It doesn't really add up" to live in the sunshine state and have that

many coats.

Waxing lyrical about her warm-up attire, she said "it's ladylike and I'm very ladylike. It

goes perfect with my personality and everything else. It's perfect for me.\*

Donning a cardigan can be a cutting edge fashion statement – football player and style

icon David Beckham has started wearing them – but, as The Independent newspaper warned today "There's a fine line between cool cat and old codger."

Federer extended his unbeaten run on grass to 60 matches when easing into the second round with a straight sets demolition of Slovakia's Dominik Hrbaty.

After much discussion at his post-match press conference about his tennis form, it was on to the cardigan.

Federer, it appears, was thrilled to put aside the white blazer he had won for the last two years.

"I thought two Jackets was enough. Let's move on to something a little bit different," he said.

"We thought about something nice like a cardigan, a jumper. I think the result is nice as well. I have a belt as well this year. Just some new fresh things. It's a little bit more easier to wear than the jacket to be honest."

#### Sharapova dons white tuxedo top for Wimbledon









First came Serena's raincoat and Roger's cardigan, then it was Maria Sharapova's white tuxedo and shorts as she upped the fashion stakes at the world's most famous tournament.

The 21-year-old Russian said she wanted to do something classy for Wimbledon so she decided to step up a gear in the tennis fashion parade when appearing on court for the first time in 2008.

"It's the tuxedo look. I was very inspired by menswear this year and every time at

Wimbledon I want to do something classy and elegant," she said after seeing off French qualifier Stephanie Foretz 6-1 6-4.

"This year I said why don't we do shorts and I have never worn shorts before at a grand slam. There is a place to do it and that's Wimbledon," the former Wimbledon champion told BBC Television right after stepping off court.

At a sun-kissed Wimbledon on Monday, Serena Williams took to the court wearing a white raincost. On a gloriously hot afternoon, defending champion Roger Federer opted for a white cardioan after two years sporting a white blazer.

Sharapova missed seeing Williams' raincoat but loved Federer's cardigan. "I thought that was classic. It was beautiful," she told reporters.

Her post-match press conference was dominated by questions about fashion. Sharapova, relaxed and laughing, was happy to answer them all.

"I love how 10 of the questions are about what we are wearing. It's amazing," she said.

Working within Wimbledon's strict dress code is a challenge she relishes. "You know it's

hard to do things different with white -- there's only so much you can do," she said.

Sharapova was clearly relieved to have got her first match out of the way at the

tournament where she became an instant overnight sensation with her win as a teenager, the first of her three Grand Slane wins.

"It was great to get out there and get a feel for Court Number One. It was my first match

on grass this year so I did pretty well considering," she said.
"You never know what is going to happen. You can have a great practice week, you can

have a terrible practice week and then go out on court and things can feel totally

She even found time at the end of her press conference to wish Russia well in the European Soccer championship after their defeat of the Netherlands in the quarter finals.

"I am so proud they got through that. It was kind of nerve-wracking when it was tied five minutes left into the game. You know we're brave, we are strong, we work hard at what we do. Good thinos hansen."














# Refined Brief

Outline- My sister Bridie plays a lot of tennis during the Summer, playing casually many rasually week during the holidays and during the term time a week nights and playing for her interclub team on sunday mornings. She normally wears one of her everyday 1-shirts and a pair of sports shorts. I have the opportunity to make her a tennis garment which is a little less casual than t-shirts and shorts. It also means she doesn't need to wear the t-shirts she wears to school who and on the weekend.

Specifications-Because it's a tennis garment it needs to be made from a light, breathable fabric that can move with the player so that she breathable tablic that can move with the player so that she isn'd going to get too hot or have any restrictions on her movement. It also needs to be machine washable because it will at some times be worn at least once a week for Aesthetics she would like it to come just above the knee, have steeres and not be dark colours. If it comes just above the knee, she won't feel self conscious that it's too short and it won't be too long that it distracts her. The skirt also needs to be wider emenument at the bottom so it won't restrict movement. However she would like it to be more fitted at the top because she prefers the look of fitted tops and she feels more she prefers the look of fitted tops and she teels comfortable when the fit her well. It would get distracting for her if it was too baggy. Having sleeves would mean that her shoulders will be protected from the sun and if it isn't a dark colour then it won't attract heat and sunlight so she won't get too hotal towever if it gets a bit colder the sleeves and as bit of length in the wouldn't get too cold either. If it is a bit fitted it won't fly up or flap around too much in the wellington wind. It should include pockets somehow so that she can have more than one ball with her at a time, but not have to hold than one ball with her at a time, but not have to hold them or put them on the ground close to her and risk standing on them. I did this sample to make sure that my print would actually work and also to see if the colours I have chosen for it work. I'm really pleased with how it looks. The branch over the leave is faded a bit so I need to pull hard on it the whole way down next time. I used normal ink for the black and green but I used opaque ink for the white so that it would stand out and be able to be seen on top of the black. I don't like the little mouth bit because it doesn't look realistic and doesn't fit in with the rest of the print. I will cover it up next time I print it.

To begin with I was developing the whole dies changing lots at a time but then I realised it would be easier and more helpful to develop each individual aspect of the dress seperately. This worked very well for me because I was able to refine those especial with my conservation with my care than change them completely which would have happened if I kept going the way was uning developments I came up with my screentiff. After \_ finished my design work I cut out my print, Photocopying it onto the ort sheet! I then did a sample of the print which turned out really well. A problem for later with the print is that if took a very long time to do because I need to do three screens. This means I will need to go quickly and Accussed when put the screens together and do the print, maybe using a Lunchtime to do it in I may also have to do a sample on my actual fabric to make sure it works because its sheetship than the Color I'll need for my sample and a slightly different colour. I'll need to do this in my own time too I think so I don't waste any class time with it I bought my fabric as well. I bought 2m of a beinge cotton lyon from the fibric have house this is for the main body, under topical and pockets. It cost \$12/m. I found some black cotton lyers at home for the ruffle on the hem and the sleeve feathers. I choose black for a comple of reasons, it goes well with the blege, it matches the main colour of the screenprint and machine embroidery, my client prefered the Sleeves to be block and it tooks relates to the fantail more than blue or green would. I haven't had to bony a pattern, I found some of my fabric so I've only spent \$24 artich has come way under my client's budget specified in the brief. The other sample I have done was for my machine embound Filve tried two methods for this, one was freehand and the other was on the Bernina Machine. For the Rechand one I got the letters printed out in the right font and size and I traved it onto some colico with pencil I then went over it with freehand machine embrodery. This turned out nicely but wasn't completely accurate to how the font looked and it took a long time to complete. Lucking both of these things can be improved by using the Bernina muchine which would do it for me. So I put the letter In the right size and font into the computer (in the right application that goes into the sewing machine) but it wouldn't work on the sewing machine. I left it with MKK to try and do but it still hasn't worked yet. When I do the machine embroidery on the actual dress I will need to put





I got the width by using her hip measurements, adding a few more centimeters for room for movement then divided it by 4 to put on the pattern (90 + 10 = 100 + 4 = 25cm) 1 Started to make the sleeve piece by parting the front and back pieces together at the shoulder seam and using the light desk to trace the Shape of the armhole. I had to make the top of the Sleeve the same length as the whole armhole even though they're slightly different shapes. I worked out that using lots of seperate Feather pieces on the sleeve will take too long to sew on. Instead I will make one piece in the shape of lots of different pieces. This will some a lot of time. I than cut but my front and back. On Friedday I didn't have fabrics but I came in at lunchtime to get some work done. Set up 2 screens so when I printed the next day, would be able to quickly. I also needed to work out where to put the print. As it is going down right along the bottom and side edges. This meant if 1 going to have to take it up or in. to do it before I printed. So I sewed the dress together quickly with a stitch length and got my sister to tm it on. I worked out by getting her to stretch and lunge in it, that the dress was is wide enough but she wanted me to take it up a lot. I marked the point she wanted it taken up to and marked it on the pattern. Once I had tempicked the temporary seam I used the pattern and cut off the rest bottom? I also started the pocket piece chrawing it so it started where she wants it and so it will be big enough (width & depth) to fit a tennis ball and her hand in. I drew it on the body pattern to begin with so the shape was right for me to be able to fit it in the body when I sew it. On Wednesday I did my screenprint. I used opaque ink for all 3 colours to make, them stand out better and last longer. The Rost screen went really well and so did the 2nd Piece between the birds tegs However I solved this problem by cutting the piece between the birds legs on the last screen so it will be printed over the black in white. This worked well This week is when it needs to be handled in I need to do the

machine embroidery, cut out the SLEENES together. think then sew it before school done if lunch conu Problems that occur this week will might embroidery It didn't work for Bernins machine to do mu Sample and also Robyn is using the need to negotiate with her to be able well. do the embroidery which hopefully won't long.

My design was simple enough to do (the shape) so I didn't need to use photographic screen primiting methods.

Reflection 25 / August Today completed my machine embroidery (with lots of Problems) but # Ms Merrick managed to get my sample to work so this meant I could do my actual one too. I put some interfacing on the back but didn't iron it (would do ofter). However the interfacing wasn't enough and so the Fabric was too flinsy and the thread kept snapping. I should have tried a sample on the Fabric I'm wing Arst. To fix this I ground 2 layers onto another piece of the fabric and then I added a strip of calico onto the back of that and tiled soain. This time it worked perfectly. I then served a nock on the inside of the back to cover up the mistake and then used the new piece of machine embroidery to sew over the outside of it like a label. I had to cut the corners off the label so that when I served the seam allowance under the corners were high and not too bulker. This and assembly took up that of our class time today so the only other thing I did was fix the sleeves posttern so the gides were the same length and added zon - seam allowance on the bottom so and making it come out I disponally so when it's folded up it will be the shape as the slow. When I got home I went Straight into trying to the feathers. I tried make the steene so it had having the feathers coming off different angles. I finally got mormal sleeve st to work and so cut out and sewed a mach sleeve but it didn't work how I wanted it too the leather bits many funny and didn't look like frather were meant to. I think becouse of the time # I have left (limited) I will just use the plain sleeve I've stready made a pattern piece for. If this means I haven't used enough techniques then I will eighter applique a feather onto the sleeves or cut but a feather Shape and have a piece of the different colour Fabric on the other side showing through. So I cut out the black sheevel tomorrow either before school or at lunch, whether if there are no problems with my sheevel lunch, whether it seems the dreft backers. will start sewing the dress together I will duffritty sen the Shoulder seems but with no problems I'll contin on with the sleeves and side seams and pocket. Then will have left will be the neck line (need to tidy if up) and the ruffle (need to make pattern for long band gather i send + overlocking everything.







Reflection 26/August Inday at lumhtime I sewed my shoulder seams and sewed in my sleeves. I am able to use plain seams sleeves because am using screen printing, machine embroidery, working with kni material and the ruffle on the bottom is my techniques and MKK said that would be enough. I then overlocked the seams I sewed making the shoulder scam allowance go towards the back and the sleeve seam allowance go down the sleeve to make them the least bulky and irritating as possible. When I was sewing (mainly on the seem thousand Shoulder scam) the thread from the bobbin wasn't always being caught by the needle making some stitches longer than the others. I tried using a different needle (a ball point = needle) which helped but didn't completely fix it. However because I'm over locking the scams as well, it doesn't matter too much. Tomorrow I will sew the side seams but will need to ask how to do the pockets which happens at the same time. Then I will find out how big to make the ruffle piece and neck bands so I can cut them out at home for if I finish the side seems) so 1/1 be ready to see than on Thursday so 1 can finish on time (Thursday last home (or if I finish the side seams) so I'll be ready to sew

Reflection 27/August princed my side seams and pockets, made my fine Todau 2 offern pieces, and sewed the hem of my sleeves and sewed the gothering stitch for my ruffle. First I sewed the pockets. I started by seaving a seam of con from the edge but only where the opening of the pocket would be. I put the right sides of the pocket and dress together did the same for IN Four pocket pieces. I then snippe up to but not past the edges of these seams I put the pockets (front left to back left etc.) together right sides in and scused round the inside edge of the pocket stopping lom away from the side seam. Then overlocked it turned the pockets round to the front (because it doesn't make sense to put them at the back) and sewed the side seam from the edge of the sheeve to the top of the pocket openning than from the bottom of the pocket byenning down to the hum. I nover lapped the pocket openning by Imm so there would be no gaps. I then over locked the side Seams. A Star 1 had a few problems with matching the edges of the sleeve in the armhole seam so unpick of the side seam and do it again th of Part times but managed to get it right. I had 2 pleces to make still 50 I made those bre which had to be for the neckline was the binding is long is the circumference of the neckline and minus 30 for stretch and 5cm wide. The other piece was for the band for the bottom ruffle. This had to be the circums. erence of the bottom of the skirt plus half again and worked out with my client where she wanted the skirt to finish and mode it that long. I had to double this because instead of hemming the ruffle (which would take a long time) and or leaving lit a raw edge (which would look messy and would curl I am folding it over so I had to Sadd Icm seem allowance to both side. I then tried a smaller sample of this ruffle which worked and books really good. I had to hem the skeve edges. I used a truin needle to do this Cafter overlocking and folding back about 1.5cm) and so had to son but the outside edge up which made it harder to know if I was getting the folded over edge so I just sewed at Icm. The double needle meant the seam was slightly stronger but also it looks a lot more proffessional and well made. It is also how her t-shirt was mode (the one I copied the pottern off) which lost nice. The last thing ! did was sew a gathering stitch with stitch length 5 along the edges e of the folded over ruffle piece sewing it at 6mm Tomorrose fred to finish I don't think I will have any problems with Anishing my garment, all hove left is the north and the hinding little



Reflection 28 /August Today I started by doing my gathering. gathered its up so it was gathered evenly and so it was allong as the skirt. I then realised I had to sew the gathered piece together this by folding it at the end so did in half then sewing the edges but then the I sam was on the outside. To make it making rless bulky and ist initiating also more quality unpicked this seam and a small section of the gathering stitch so | could sew the Whole width of the band right sides together so the seem would be inside. Then I pinned the githered band to the skirt matching up each guster (folded in half then in half again). Then sewed them together. had to unpick one of the side seams because it was sewen towards the back but it needed to be sewen towards the front so the pockets would stan towards the front. Then overlocked flad to go back over a few spots because the beige hadn't been caught up. I could do a row stitching along the bottom to keep the botto ruffle down but I think the weight of the ruffle will keep it down by itself. did the binding around the neckline. I used the iron and folded the edges into the middle of the band (lengthwix). I then folded the entire band almost in half jut so one of the edges was a few mm below the other. This was so because I am wing the twin needle 1 so can't see the back but will definitley cotch both sides sewing them. 1 pinned it on the same way to I pinned the ruffle (in gusters) and sewed it on This makes the neck look very proffessionally finished. The last thing I had to do was apprice a patch where the overlocker had caught the direct and then re overlock it. Then I was done.

Evaluation I'm really pleased with how my garment turned out I think it looks really professionally made and good quality. My solution meets the constraints and because I came \$26 dothers under budget, it fits her perfectly, I have included techniques that I explored in our last project and it Aits the purpose of a tennis dress. Because I didn't buy a pattern and I only needed to buy one of my fabrics which cost \$12 = metre (1 got two) 1 only spent \$294 and my clients budget was \$50. Throughout making the garment I kept trying it on my client. This meant it fit her well because I could alter it if it didn't. Also because I used a pattern from one of her +-shirts this meant that it would fit her quite well anyway since her t-shirt fits her well. It fits the purpose of a tennis dress because it is light, it stretches, it is breathable, the pockets At a tennis ball and her hand. it moves well with her and there's nothing that will distract or irritate her. It meets and exceeds the specifications because it won't make her too hot or too cold (bresthable fabric but still has some length), it won't have any restrictions on her movement (because of the stretch and the skirt is quite wide, it is machine washable (the fabric is able to be washed in a machine and there is no details that will be rained in a machine, it comes just above the knee (she specified where, she wanted it to come down to when it was on her) and it has skeeves and it isn't dork colours (except the trims is skeened) so it won't attract the sun. Because the dress has no intricate details or flimsy bits it will be able to last a long time. The fabric isn't flimsy and might fade in colour slightly. The only thing that will definitley change over time will be the screen print which will fode. I my design would be very Viable. It is easy to make where the only tricky bits (only because they're time consuming) are the screenprint and mochine embraidury However they compare very well with cost am with other products similar to this. Tennis outfits are usually at least \$60 plus and offen you can only buy shirts and skirts seperately T-shirts and dresses sold in regular clothing stores would definitely be more expensive than this If I had to buy the back fabric also, it would have been a bit more expensive but not too much more still around \$30 which is less than what you'd in a Shop. The stretch may get stretchier and more relaxed over time also making it slightly more baggy but since it fits her vestly well now it shouldn't make too much difference or matter too much.
